

GENERAL HORTICULTURAL RULES

- 1. This show is organized, staged and judged in accordance with the rules of the American Rose Society. Peninsula Rose Society rules shall prevail.
- 2. Unless otherwise noted in this schedule, competition is open to all rose growers regardless of residence. Exhibitors who qualify as novices may enter in Section "N". However, a novice may enter in any other section open to exhibitors not judging the show. Sections "J" is open to persons judging the show.
- 3. Each exhibit must be staged in conformity with the show schedule. In accordance with ARS guidelines this will be an alphabetical show. Deviation from these rules shall be cause for disqualification of the exhibit. Wedges are permitted but must be below lip of container and unobtrusive.
- 4. Doors open to exhibitors at 7:00 AM. All entries must be in place and ready for judging by 10:00 AM, Sunday, May 1, 2022. NO ENTRY WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER THIS TIME. Placement Committee will place all entries with the exception of Challenge classes and Rose Arrangements.
- 5. All roses must have been grown by the exhibitor in a private outdoor garden. Only one person or team from any one garden may enter a class. Arrangement classes are excepted unless otherwise specified.

- 6. The approved exhibition name, color, and class will be determined by the following ARS publications: Modern Roses, Official List of Approved Exhibition Names for Exhibitors & Judges, Handbook for Selecting Roses, Rose Registrations and online database for Modern Roses (most recent source) on the ARS Website. In case of conflict between these sources, the latest one published shall take precedence. In case a variety is not listed in any of the above ARS official publications, the Combined Rose List* may be used as a reference. All roses must be correctly named or the entry will be disqualified.
- 7. *In case of conflict between ARS publications and the Combined Rose List, ARS publications (particularly, the latest supplements to these publications) will be the final authority.
- 8. Any number of entries may be made by an exhibitor or team from one garden in each class except Challenge classes which are limited as it shows on the Schedule to two entries per class. Violation of the foregoing shall result in disqualification of all entries by that exhibitor in the class involved. Section "J" shall be limited to two entries per exhibitor per class, provided each entry is of a different variety.
- 9. First, second, third place and honorable mention ribbons will be awarded in each class, if warranted. Four or more entries of the same variety in any one class shall be judged as a separate class. More than one first, second or third place ribbon may be awarded in a class, at the discretion of the judges. However, in Section "C" there can be only one trophy winner in each basic class. The decision of the judges will be final.
- 10. Containers and entry tags for the specimen classes will be supplied by the Peninsula Rose Society, Inc. Entry tags must be completed on both the top and bottom portions with Section, Class, Variety Name and Exhibitor's Name and Address.
- 11. Peninsula Rose Society, Inc., will not be responsible for private containers, loss or damage to exhibits, or personal property of the exhibitors.
- 12. Entries may not be removed before 4:00 PM on the day of the show.
- 13. All trophies may be photographed with winners but not removed and are property of Peninsula Rose Society, Inc. Trophies will be awarded to Blue-Ribbon winners only.
- 14. Trophies and ribbons will be summarized at the next monthly Peninsula Rose Society meeting following the date of the Show, held on the third Tuesday of the month at 7:30 PM in the Veterans Memorial Building, 1455 Madison Ave, Redwood City.
- 15. No one shall be permitted on the show floor during judging except those duly authorized by the Chairman of Judges and/or approved by the General Show Chair.

HELPFUL HINTS AND GUIDELINES

- 1. Blooms and foliage should be cleaned of insects, fungus or spray residue, using a soft damp cloth, brush or other aid. Even clean dry fingers can help. Never apply any foreign substance, such as oil or wax, to improve appearance.
- 2. Foliage: Specimen blooms (except miniature or min-flora) should have at least two five-leaflet leaves. Miniatures and Mini-Floras should have at least one five-leaflet leaf. It is preferable to have more leaves to complement the bloom. Do not jam foliage into the bottle.

- 3. Hybrid teas: For one bloom per stem entries, pinch out the side buds as soon as they are observed and removable. Side buds are a penalty but not disqualification. Do not wait until the day of the show. Exhibition Blooms should be 1/2 to 3/4 open with high pointed center.
- 4. Grandifloras: Rules for Hybrid Teas apply to one bloom Grandifloras. Grandiflora sprays shall be judged by the same standards as floribunda sprays, but the "ideal" spray of an exhibition form grandiflora showing all blooms at exhibition stage shall take preference over one showing stages of bloom, if all other elements are equal.
- 5. Floribundas: Pinch out terminal bud of Floribunda sprays while buds are still immature. Sprays must have at least two open blooms.
- 6. Stems: A stem-on-stem specimen is not disqualified. It is subject to penalty compared to an entry without a stem-on-stem condition. No stem-on-stem is considered superior to an entry with stem-on-stem, all other elements being equal. Ensure that the stem is in water. If you remove the stem from water for as long as half a minute, snip 1/4 inch off the end to ensure drawing water.
- 7. Single Roses: Single roses are varieties with 4-8 petals and are at their most perfect phase of possible beauty when fully open, showing fresh stamens and anthers, which are subject to penalty for a color fault if golden yellow anthers have blackened.

GENERAL ARRANGEMENT RULES

- 1. Doors open at 7:00 AM for preparation of entries. All entries must be in place and ready for judging by 10:00 AM.
- 2. Please place name, address, and telephone number on all containers and accessories. The Peninsula Rose Society will exercise due caution in protecting all exhibits, but cannot be responsible for damage or loss of property.
- 3. All exhibits and trophies must remain in place until the close of the show. After judging, trophies and certificates will be available next to winning arrangements. PRS plans to take photos of the arrangements plus awards and to have photos posted on the PRS website after the show. We plan to take photos of the available exhibitors with their trophies or awards for posting (with permission). Entry tag stubs will be held by the Society for record keeping. If Certificates and Rosettes are not collected by the exhibitor, they will be mailed to winners. Please remove designs and personal property by 4:30 PM. Show closes to Public at 4:00 PM.
- 4. Exhibitors will be permitted on the floor only during the time of placement, except those exhibitors who are clerks during the judging.
- 5. The schedule is the law of the show. All entries must conform to the schedule. The decision of the judges is final.
- 6. Divisions except Judges are open to all amateur rose growers.
- 7. The show rules are in accordance with American Rose Society rules for arrangements as available on the www.rose.org site under publications.

Those exhibitors entering the show agree to abide by the following rules:

- a. All roses must be outdoor garden grown and must be of high quality.
- b. A rose or roses must be the dominant flower in all arrangements.
- c. The ARS Approved Exhibition Name of all roses in each arrangement must be written on the entry tag.
- d. "AG" must be written on the entry tag if roses are arranger-grown so that the entry will be eligible for an ARS medal certificate.
- e. One entry per exhibitor is allowed in each class, but an exhibitor may enter as many classes as desired. More than one exhibitor from the same garden may enter the same class.
- f. Accessories are allowed unless stated otherwise in the schedule.
- g. Flowers other than roses, and dried and/or treated dried plant material are allowed unless prohibited by the schedule.
- h. A card of intent may be included with an arrangement as an explanation of the arranger's interpretation of the theme or class title, unless the schedule specifically forbids it.
- i. An arrangement incorrectly placed in a class will be judged in the class in which it is placed.
- j. All entries must be the work of the exhibitor.
- k. No one but the exhibitor may touch or move an arrangement. However, in special circumstances, if all efforts to locate the arranger have failed, the arrangement chairman may carefully move an arrangement.
- 8. <u>Accessories are permitted in all classes unless otherwise stated.</u> Stands, mats, bases and backgrounds are not considered accessories.
- 9. Trophies and awards will be given to Blue-Ribbon winners only.

- 8. Highest point scoring Blue-Ribbon winners in Division I through VI shall be judged to determine best arrangement of show. AWARDS Edith Barrette Trophy plus Best Arrangement Rosette. The arrangement judged the most creative will be awarded the Earl Parsons Trophy.
- 9. All awards and trophies will be on display next to the arrangements 1:00 to 4:00 PM. If winners are present, we will take photos of the arrangement, the awards plus winners, as well as the arrangements for later publishing on the PRS website Any certificates and rosettes will be mailed to winners if not collected on site at the close of the show.
- 10. All arrangements shall not exceed 26" width and depth unless otherwise noted.
- 11. Severe penalties will be levied for use of painted, dyed, or treated fresh plant material, national flags, live animals, or plant materials on the state or local conservation list.
- 14. Entries will be disqualified if roses are not outdoor-grown or if artificial plant material is used.

SECTION AR: Rose Arrangement Division

All arrangers should put "AG" (arranger grown) on entry tags to be eligible for all ARS awards and certificates. Must write type of arrangement on entry tag or separate card.

The exhibitor with the best Blue-Ribbon entry in Classes 1 – 14 is eligible for:

- Edith Barrette Trophy
- Best of Show Rosettes Queen, King, or Princess
- Certificates for Best Arrangements Queen, King, or Princess
- Most Creative in Classes 1-14 wins Earl Parsons Trophy
