Planting an Own-Root Potted Rose (1 gallon and larger pot)

- 1. Water the pot well the day before
- 2. Dig a hole at least 2x the size of the pot (in full sun)
- 3. Amend the soil about 1/3 with well-aged compost
- 4. Work organic starter fertilizer into the hole bottom
- 5. No chemical fertilizers or raw manure-delicate roots
- 6. Refill the hole with amended soil ½ way
- 7. Tap the pot on the sides (if it is a fiber pot, poke/ slit holes)
- 8. Gently slide the root ball onto the soil (place if fiber)
- 9. Fill around the root ball and tamp down lightly
- 10. Stake the plant if needed
- 11. Make sure to tag the plant
- 12. Water well, Keep the soil very moist for a week+
- 13. In hot weather watch out for drying and wilting
- 14. Gradually change to less frequent watering, deeply
- 15. Use no chemical fertilizers the first year.
