April: Hi-low- Display paired roses, one large and one small, matched in form, color, and openness, each in its container with separate tags.

May: Tin can derby- A bouquet of roses creatively presented in a tin can.

June: Stages of bloom- Each stem displayed individually: one fully opened with stamens showing, one at exhibition stage, and one as an opening bud with unfurling petals.

September: Trailing rose- Display one spray or more, exhibited lying in a container on the table.

Section I – Arrangements- designate the arrangement scheme on the entry tag

Class I-1: Design, Traditional

Class I-2: Design, Modern

Class I-3: Design, East Asian

April: The Joy of Roses, create an arrangement showing your enjoyment of roses.

May: Monochromatic Beauty, create arrangements using flowers of a single color.

June: Beach Vibes, create an arrangement that reminds you of a day at the beach.

September: Rustic Charm, emphasis on natural and rustic elements in the arrangements.

Peninsula Rose Society Monthly Rose Show Exhibition Rules and Regulations

Award Points:

- First Place – 5 points, Second Place – 3 points, Third Place – 1 point.
- The Best of Show designation earns bonus 5 points (A-G), 5 bonus points for Best Challenge (H) and 5 bonus points for Best Arrangement (I).

At the end-of-year winter party, the first, second, and third-place winners of each Section will receive prizes.

Exhibitors:

Competition is open to all PRS members. An established status from another rose society may be accepted.

The Monthly Show Chairperson and the Assistant Show Chairperson may compete in the monthly show.

All entries must have been grown in the exhibitor's outdoor garden (arrangements excepted or as specified).

Absentee members may have someone else deliver their entries provided such entries are grown, prepared, and groomed by the exhibitor.

Novices are limited to exhibitors who have won less than three first places in the monthly shows. All Novice exhibitors must designate their status by writing "Novice" on each rose show entry tag. The Novice who wins the most total points at the end of the show year automatically moves up to the Advanced Class. The Novice who wins the most total points in arrangement at the end of the show year automatically moves up to the Advanced Class.

Exhibits:

Entry tags may be furnished by PRS or the exhibitor. Exhibitors will furnish their own containers; only clear see-through containers are permitted.

Each exhibitor may enter three different entries per class.

Wedges are permitted but must not protrude above the lip of the container.

Entries must be in place by 7pm on the day of the show. Late arrivals will be placed on the non-competitive table at the discretion of the monthly rose show judge and clerk.
