Class H-1: Rose in a Bowl

Class H-2: Other Challenges- designate the challenge on the entry tag

- April: <u>Twin shrub</u>, 2 vases, 1 stem in each vase. Most decorative form, same variety. Either 2 single blooms (one in each vase) or 2 sprays. Any type of shrub, including English.
- May: My Garden's Star, participants display the best rose from their garden—any variety or type—with a note explaining why it's their favorite.
- June: <u>Fragrance Challenge</u>, participants display a single rose chosen specifically for its fragrance. Judges assess based on scent strength and quality.
- September: <u>The Odd Couple</u>, showcase two roses of *different* varieties, displayed sideby-side to highlight contrast in color, form, or size.

Section I - Arrangements- designate the arrangement scheme on the entry tag

Class I-1: Design, Traditional Class I-2: Design, Modern Class I-3: Design, East Asian

- April: <u>Transparence</u> roses at the front and back, with a semi-transparent screen of leaves or other materials in between. The design creates depth and balance, allowing for an elegant and visually appealing composition.
- May: <u>Symphony in Color</u>, arrangements that celebrate bold contrasts of warm and cool tones in striking designs.
- o June: <u>Urban Elegance Modern</u>, sleek arrangements with clean lines and sophistication.
- September: <u>Blossoms and Branches</u>, incorporate branches or wood for a natural, textured design.

Exhibition Rules and Regulations

Award Points:

- o <u>First Place</u> 5 points, <u>Second Place</u> 3 points, <u>Third Place</u> 1 point.
- The <u>Best of Show</u> designation earns a bonus of 5 points for <u>large flowers</u> (A-F), 5 bonus points for <u>Minis</u> (G), 5 bonus points for <u>Best Arrangement</u> (I).

Prizes will be awarded at the end of the year.

Exhibitors:

The competition is open to all PRS members. An established status from another rose society may be accepted.

All entries must have been grown in the exhibitor's outdoor garden (arrangements excepted or as specified).

Novices are exhibitors who have won less than three first places in the monthly shows. All Novice exhibitors must write "Novice" on each of their entry tags.

The Novice who wins the most total points at the end of the show year automatically moves up to the Advanced Class. The Novice who wins the most total points in arrangement at the end of the show year automatically moves up to the Advanced Class.

Exhibits:

PRS or the exhibitor may furnish entry tags. Exhibitors will furnish their containers; only clear, see-through containers are permitted.

Each exhibitor may enter three different entries per class.

Wedges are permitted but must not protrude above the lip of the container.

Entries must be in by 7 p.m. on the day of the show. At the discretion of the monthly rose show judge and clerk, late arrivals will be placed on the non-competitive table.

Special Challenges and Arrangement schemes will be announced in the Peninsula Rosarian newsletter.
