**April: Color Harmony** – Three blooms in similar hues or varying tones, arranged to highlight subtle contrasts and depth.

**May: Fragrance Fantasy**- Show one or more roses in a creative container, emphasizing aroma and imaginative presentation.

**June: Mini Marvels**- Miniature roses, highlighting delicate beauty and charm.

**Sept: Once Upon a Rose**- Share your favorite rose with a brief story, poem, or reflection inspired by its color, scent, or feeling.



**Section J – Arrangements-** For Large or Miniature Roses, note the arrangement scheme on the entry tag.

Class J-1: Design, Traditional

Class J-2: Design, Modern

Class J-3: Design, East Asian

**April: Candy Crush-** Blooms arranged like a cheerful candy display.

**May: Butterfly Kisses-** A light, airy arrangement of roses suggesting the gentle flutter of butterflies.

**June: Magic Potion-** Roses in playful containers like jars, bottles, or teapots.

**Sept: Peek-a-Boo-** Roses partially hidden or layered to create a fun, surprise effect.

### Exhibition Rules and Regulations

#### **Award Points:**

- **First Place:** 5 points, **Second Place:** 3 points, **Third Place:** 1 point.
- **The Best of Show** earns an additional 5 bonus points in these categories:
  - Large Flower (A–G)
  - Miniatures (H)
  - Best Challenge (I)
  - Best Arrangement – Large Flowers (J)
  - Best Arrangement – Miniatures (J)

The president will ask each monthly rose show winner to stand and be recognized.

Annual winners will be honored at the Christmas Party.

#### **Exhibitors:**

The competition is open to all PRS members. An established status from another rose society may be accepted.

The Monthly Show Chairperson and the Assistant Show Chairperson may compete in the monthly show. All entries must have been grown in the exhibitor's outdoor garden (arrangements excepted or as specified).

Absentee members may have someone else deliver their entries provided such entries are grown, prepared, and groomed by the exhibitor.

#### **Novices:**

All Novice exhibitors must designate their status by writing "Novice" on each rose show entry tag.

All exhibits in the monthly rose show are open to both Novice and Advanced exhibitors; there is no separate exhibit limited to Novices.

Novice moves up to the Advanced Class by having at least three First Place wins in monthly rose show exhibits.

#### **Exhibits:**

PRS or the exhibitor may furnish entry tags. Exhibitors are required to furnish their own containers, and only clear, see-through containers are permitted.

Each exhibitor may enter three different entries per class.

Wedges are permitted but must not protrude above the lip of the container.

Entries must be in by 7 p.m. on the day of the show. At the discretion of the monthly rose show judge and clerk, late arrivals will be placed on the non-competitive table.
